 - (b) Determine the intercepts of this plane with the coordinate axes x, y and z.





Figure 1: Problem 1

(b) One of these functions does have a limit as $(x,y) \to (0,0)$. Determine which one and based on its graph given below state what is the limit.




Figure 3: f(x,y) or g(x,y)





Figure 4: f(x,y) or g(x,y)
